

After a lengthy publicity campaign through newsletters, mass emails and social media, the weekend kicked off with Athletic Night at Spirale on May 10th. A spirited gathering of almost 300 former athletes and coaches spent the evening enjoying one another's company and reliving both the joys of victory and the agonies of defeat.

May 11th saw 72 golfers tackle the North Course of Angus Glen — it may be the home of the 2007 Canadian Open but was no match for our contingent of Norsemen! A beautiful spring day, great food and a beer sponsor made for a wonderful day out on the links.

Later that day, over 1200 people attended at Roy Thomson Hall for the one-time performance of Memories Forever — a Maytime Melodies-style concert featuring hundreds of alumni musicians and chorus members, including numerous guest

conductors. The evening featured all the greatest hits of an NT concert, right down to closing the place down with the school song, as well as a specially-commissioned medley. These are the moments to remember.

Board Chair Neal Irwin Retires

After nine years at the helm of the NT Alumni Advisory Board, Neal Irwin is stepping down and we on the Board feel that his extraordinary contribution should not go unheralded. Coincidentally, Neal became Co-chair of the Board at the start of what became the busiest period in this organization's lengthy history.

Two of the most important events in NT history came about within months of each other; the building of the new school and the 100th Anniversary celebrations, both requiring considerable input from the Advisory Board. On top of that, it was decided to bring out electronic versions of both the annual newsletter and the periodic mailings, which necessitated a complete overhaul of the database.

Early on, it was decided that we should raise around \$300,000 to ensure creation of appropriate memorabilia in the new school as well as preservation of the historical items the Advisory Board already had responsibility for. This includes all of the display cases, the various paintings in the library and elsewhere, the lists of alumni who fought in the wars and the grads who received scholarships. Committees were struck to oversee the building of the Memorial Courtyard and the Heritage Room, along with the storage room for memorabilia.

Getting things done with a volunteer board is always a challenge because there is such a mix of backgrounds and level of experience. Neal, whose background is in engineering, was terrific in terms of keeping track of everything the board was responsible for. He gave gentle nudges to make sure tasks were completed, and managed to gain the respect of everyone who worked with him.

When it came to light that the budget for the new field did not include money for the end-zone decorations of the logo at mid-field, the Board elected to appropriate the required cash and have the spectacular red additions made to the end zones and a new logo installed.

As Chair, Neal had to oversee all of the committees, liaise with the school and Board staff, the architects and builder's representatives, attend all of the various meetings and Alumni functions and make sure everybody stepped up to the plate in a diplomatic a fashion as possible, even with last minute emergencies. For the two dozen or so Board members, this was an enormous amount of work and I'm pleased to report that Neal made it seem, not only possible, but that we could have fun accomplishing it.

Four years on we can look back at great successes, no disasters and an enduring legacy that staff and students can be proud of in the decades to come and we primarily have Neal to thank for this. Amazingly, thanks to the generosity of over 500 donors, our fundraising efforts surpassed the original goal by \$20,000.

The Heritage Courtyard is a wonderful space for students to hang out while maintaining a suitable tribute to the old school and those who donated towards the heritage projects.

Thank you from all of us, Neal, and may we continue to enjoy your participation.
