4. Treasurer's Report and financial requests— Charlotte Ryan

- Current balance after fees were deposited is \$23,783
- 3 financial requests were submitted for approval this month (all were accepted):
 - 1) \$350 (Ms. Withers) for promoting Free the Children charity (money is needed for flyers, marketing, printing raffle prizes). There will be events in the school to raise money, (& other school groups) leadership event motioned by Teodora Miloradovic, seconded by Pauline Thompson, accepted by all
 - 2) \$250 (Ms. de Braux) for the Lunch & Learn series for students on stress relief (by social worker Jean Middlebrook and Ms. Dobreau). Money is needed for the honorarium for the speakers motioned by Teodora Miloradovic, seconded by Pauline Thompson, accepted by all

5. Post-secondary choices – presented by Ms. de Braux, Head of Guidance department

- Career is not about narrowing choices, but widening them, children will focus themselves
- Don't ask "what do you want to be when you grow up?", but rather "What are you interested in?"
- Share your experiences
- A lot of children will not know what they want at the end of high school
- 4 post-secondary destinations
 - Workplace
 - o Apprenticeship
 - Community college 2-3 year diploma, or 3-4 year applied degree, prepares for workplace, industry driven, most offer reciprocal deals with universities, to transfer there after 2 years of college directly into 3rd year university (cheaper option)
 - University 4-year degree programs, theoretical, specific course req's (top 6 Gr. 12 marks from U/M courses, min avg. 70% or more), does not always lead to work, need professional certification/degree after

- Listen to the kids, if to them it's more about "doing", knowing what they want, college might be better, but if they love "thinking", not sure what career they want, university might be better, they'll find their "bliss" there
- Ensure to subscribe to NT Grad mailing list (in Grade 11 also), lots of useful information re post-secondary info, incl. on scholarships
- Students should keep a detailed file on volunteer work, extracurricular activities, awards, achievements very important for university admittance.
- Post secondary schools/universities have "requirements" (must have's) and "recommendations" (good to have) for each program
- If optional 5th year is selected at NTCI, students must take min 6 courses, Co-op can be 4 of 6 courses, or can go to a semestral school elsewhere
- Students should plan to graduate after 4th year, complete 40 h of required volunteer work and all other requirements for graduation
