3b. Vice Principal Report-Kathleen Pyper (M-Z)

5. Treasurer's report and financial requests- Anne Ferguson

- Our starting balance is \$4431.75. There are four requests for financial aid.
- A request for \$1500 was made by the Student Exchange program, which promotes cultural awareness among students. This year student's exchange is with students from Copenhagen. While the exchange students from Copenhagen are here they will attend a two day camp with NTCI students. Total cost of the program is \$8850.
- A request for \$900 was made for CPR certification for Grade 9 girls. The cost breaks down to \$5/student. There is a two week unit in first Aid and CPR. Total cost of the program is \$4500
- A request was made for \$1000 for the Strings retreat-Music department. There is a three day retreat to provide performance and teamwork skills enrichment. Total cost for the program is \$24,943

- A request was made for \$400 by the WPHE dept. for Grade 10 girls to have a two week unit on self defense. The cost breaks down to \$5/student. Total cost for the program is \$1600.
- The total amount of all above requests is \$3800. A motion to approve was made by Joanne Archibald and seconded by Ivana Marzura and accepted by all.

6. Staff Presentation: Technology in the classroom- Brian Roche & Mark Kinoshita

- What is a Moodle? It is web-based software which offers an interactive platform and blended learning. Learning can occur at home but it is not an online course.
