• Highlighted the importance of attendance and punctuality and reviewed procedures for late arrival and absences.

• Advised the school enrolment is largest its ever been. Grade 9 has 350 students (biggest on record). The school has been awarded 2 more teachers and there will be some class/teacher changes as a result and they can't be changed back.

• Supported the concept of building resilience in your child(ren) by allowing them to fail or faulted at times because bad news is part of life and they need practice dealing with it. Short cuts don't help them succeed when challenges confront them. Full time course load prepares them for university. 94% of NT grad attend university.
