Welcome by Eric Miglin: Chair

Student Council Report Lyndsey Gott: (President)

- Charity Week: Pathways to Education is the chosen charity for this year's Charity Week. This is a charity started up in 2000, that is based out of Regent Park, with a mission to ensure disadvantaged youth attend high school. There are many great activities happening including NT Idol, Scavenger Hunt, Washroom Survivor, Most Extreme Challenge and also a Fashion Show (late February). After two days, \$2300 has already been raised!

- Spring Fling Week: This week will take place in early April and lots of fun activities are being planned. There may be events with fund-raising towards NT's Equity Council.
- <u>Honduras Trip:</u> NT students who went to Honduras have returned! The students indicated it was an absolutely incredible trip and the trip has had a huge impact on the students.

<u>Music is for Everyone: The power and Importance of Music in Education and our Lives (Ivars Taurins, NTCI 1975 Grad):</u>

- North Toronto's Influence: NT has had a huge influence on Ivars Taurins' career he does not believe it could have happened without the experiences at NT.
- <u>Directing Youth Choir:</u> Ivars chose a classical repertoire, although very challenging. The students rose to the challenge. It was an emotional experience for students and audience alike.
- <u>Music's potential</u> is often ignored and music is taken for granted, thought of simply as entertainment. Music's potential is much more than that it can stimulate our brains, it has the power to transform lives. We treat the arts and culture like we treat the environment we are only now realizing that we have to actively take care of them. A visionary once said that a child given the opportunity for music and to carry an instrument, will not carry a gun.
- <u>Venezuela</u>: A radical social project is happening in Venezuela, where children are given an instrument, tuition etc. in return for playing in performance ensembles. Children rise out of poverty to practice 4 hours per day, 6 days per week in 90 schools across the country. The government funds the schools to the tune of \$29 million a year, in a country where the average annual income is less than \$3500! In Venezuela, by feeding people's souls, they are finding a way for people to feed themselves. Ivars shared some remarkable stories of children from very poor families who have begun new lives and risen above poverty as a result of this program.
- <u>Music positive's effects:</u> Music requires discipline and learning music instills habits that last a lifetime. As a person learns music, their cognitive abilities are stretched. There are so many positive benefits. The Arts link cognitive growth to social and emotional development.
