- Understating teen brain instinctive part is more prevalent than the rational part, underdeveloped until their 20's
- Three crucial strategies:
 - 1) tolerate negativity
 - 2) show ruthless compassion, deep empathy
 - 3) be non-defensive, "mirror back", accept what they are saying
- Mirroring technique use it to de-escalate the conflict, put yourself in their shows, show how much you understand
 - C connect, stop what you are doing, show you are fully focused, listening
 - A affect matching, show how interested you are
 - L lack of language, use few words, show you'll work with them/for them
 - M mirror back
