### 5. Special Topic

• Substance Use and Abuse...What a Parent Should Know - Mr.David Kaufman - from Jewish Addiction Community Services who provides many support groups related to Addiction.

Mr. Kaufmann spoke eloquently about the challenge of raising a child, not intuitive, loving is often enabling those with addictions. Parents who learn how to talk to their teens about drugs will reduce the risk of addiction in their children. The characteristics of addiction: obsession of the mind and body, need for more, withdrawal, negative consequences. There are 3 stages to over come addiction: 1. Denial 2. Education3. Plan of action. Recovery has more to do with addicts have stagnated emotionally from the addiction and less to do with coming off the drugs. Recovery is learning how to live life on life's terms.

He advises that you don't need to panic if you find your kids are doing drugs. Most experiment and most don't become addicted. He cautions that drugs today are not what they were 20 years ago, e.g. THC content today is 22-23% and it used to be 8%. This causes high risk of psychiatric illness e.g. psychosis, depression. The Health Canada drug information sheet for marijuana

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advises not to be used before age 25. JACS offers a number of courses and he walked the attendees positive motivation strategies in communicating with your teens.
