1. Welcome and Announcements [Jess Hungate, Chair]

2. Staff Update [Mr. Taylor]

- a) Universities have just received the 3rd report cards from April 10th today. The final report card is not helpful for university acceptance. Final marks in Grade 11 do often help with university acceptance.

3. Programme: Sara Dimerman, Dip.C.S, C.Psych.: "Don't Leave, Please Go: what you (and your teen) need to know before heading to university or college"

Dr. Dimerman presented a topical and practical discussion regarding students leaving home for post-secondary education. She recommended: prepare for more conflict at home in grade 12, investigate resources at the institution your child is attending, watch for safety issues, validate and

acknowledge their feelings, and expect marks to drop from grade 12 to 1st year post-secondary. An engaging Q&A followed with an engaged audience of parents.
